SPECIAL NOTICE FOR ACCESS TO AND AROUND CAMP PRIME TIME

Starting July 1, Yakama Nation Fisheries will begin clearing trees near Clear Lake Dam to support the upcoming Bureau of Reclamation's Clear Creek Dam Fish Passage Project. Approximately 50 trees removed from the one acre clearing area will be transported to nearby Clear Creek and placed instream to enhance fish habitat. The remaining trees will be hauled around Clear Lake to a rock pit accessed from National Forest Road 1200-737, and stored for other project uses. There will be heavy equipment and logging truck traffic on National Forest Roads 1200-737, 1200-740, 1200-540, and on Tieton Road (County road) so please drive defensively.

Due to public safety concerns with heavy equipment working in the area, the rock pit site (commonly used by OHV groups) will be closed to public use from July 1 through August 31. Please be prepared for traffic control in the area to allow for log truck hauling. We are aware this area is popular for recreational use and appreciate your cooperation. The project site is located at Clear Lake on the Naches Ranger District, approximately 33 miles west of Naches, WA.
