Information for Campers

The following information is very important, to help you plan effectively for the weekend.

- Each cabin has bunks and NO cribs. Bring sleeping bags or blankets, pillows, toiletries, bug spray, sunscreen, medications, flashlights & anything else you may need. (Please bring protection for the mattresses if incontinence is a concern.) We have high chairs for the little ones at mealtime.
- 2. Pets are <u>not</u> allowed at camp. Service animals are allowed with proper certification (same as the airlines require) received at least two (2) days before arrival.
- Camp has two restrooms, with hot and cold running water and showers. The lower restroom has a tub and changing table to assist those who use wheelchairs. All the cabins have electricity and propane stoves.
- 4. Please let your group leader and the camp know if you have to cancel your plans. There is often a long waiting list of families who would love an opportunity to be at camp and we may be able to accommodate them if we have advance notice.
- 5. Prime Time has arranged volunteers to do the cooking and facilitate some of the activities so that you can have time to enjoy the beautiful surroundings. Please know they are there to assist you and to make certain the camp is run safely. However, you must always supervise your family members.

1:30-5:00 pm

Boat rides may continue & other activities are available including fishing (we have rods and gear), hiking, scenic drives, enjoying the playroom, basketball,

and the Treehouse.

6:00 pm Dinner served.

Sing-a-long at the campfire after dark with S'mores.

DAY THREE:

8:30 am Breakfast served.

Pick up sack lunches to go.

Pack up, check & clean up your cabins, and say goodbyes.

1:00 pm Camp closes.
